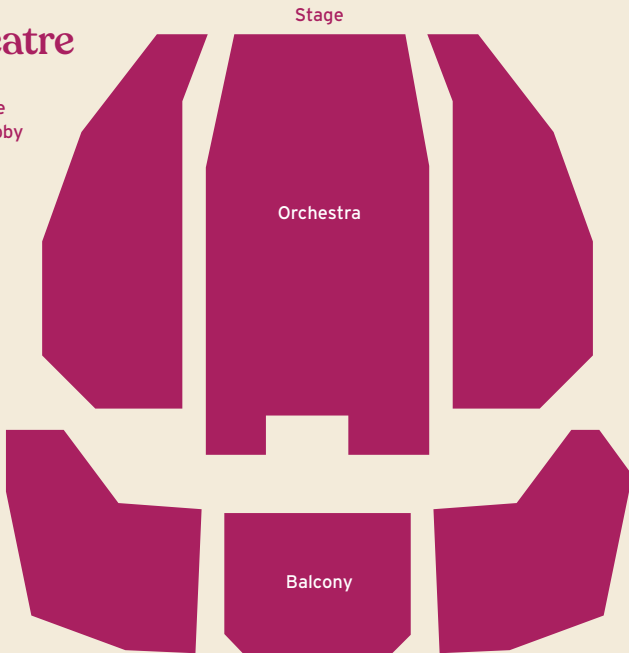
## Group Booking Policies
